Divine Mercy Sunday

Did you know that in the 1930's Our Lord Jesus requested through St. Faustina that a Feast of Divine Mercy be established and solemnly celebrated in His Church on the First Sunday after Easter every year? In the year 2000 after many years of study by the Catholic Church, Pope John Paul II fulfilled the will of Christ and officially established that Feast of Divine Mercy and named it Divine Mercy Sunday.

What is so special about this new Feast of Divine Mercy you might ask? It is the promise of the total forgiveness of all sins and punishment for anyone that would go to Confession and receive Communion on that very special Feast of Divine Mercy! Why would Jesus offer us something so great right now? Jesus told St. Faustina that she was to prepare the world for His Second Coming and He wants to pour out His Mercy before He comes again as the Just Judge and as a last hope of salvation.

We will have Divine Mercy Devotions on Sunday April 23 at St. Mary's and St. Norbert's at 3:00 pm.

We will begin with Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, along with Divine Mercy Chaplet, Scripture Readings and Reposition with Benediction.

"On this day, the very depths of My tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon souls who approach the fount of My mercy. The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins AND PUNISHMENT. (Diary of St. Faustina, 699)

In preparation for Divine Mercy Sunday, our Lord offers us a Novena of prayer from Good Friday to Divine Mercy Sunday. For each day we can offer a prayer and The Divine mercy Chaplet for a specific intention:

- Day 1 : All mankind, especially sinners.
- Day 2: The Souls of priests and religious
- Day 3: All devout and faithful souls
- Day 4: Those who do not believe in God and those who do not yet know Jesus
- Day 5: The souls of those who have separated themselves from the Church
- Day 6: The meek and humble souls and the souls of little children
- Day 7: The souls who especially venerate and glorify His Mercy
- Day 8: The souls in purgatory
- Day 9: Souls who have become lukewarm


