Food and Drink. Flesh and Blood. In his Gospel, Saint John shares three related levels of "flesh and blood" concerning Jesus Christ. (1) He is human, just like us (in all things but sin). (2) He did suffer and die on the cross (once for all). (3) He gives himself as food and drink – and longs for each of us and all of us to dine at this ritual meal (Sunday Mass). Although one form, one Eucharistic species is enough for valid Communion, why should I both eat and drink? How can drinking from the Communion cup bind me more closely to Jesus Christ? How does this drinking and eating meld me more richly with the community of believers?
