St. Francis of Assisi in need of a store to reopen clothing charity.

St. Francis of Assisi is considering re-opening the clothing charity that was previously operated as part of the Lutheran Church Hardin Pantry. For years the Lutheran Church provided this valuable service along with a food charity in the basement of St. Paul's Lutheran Church in Hardin. However, these services were terminated this past June. The food charity is being partially replaced by a mobile service out of St. Louis, but there is presently no clothing service for Calhoun.

St. Francis of Assisi is presently considering taking on this service, but has need of a store from which to operate. Hardin seems to be the best place to locate this service but we need about 1000 square feet of store space, handicap accessible, with a bathroom as our minimum needs and we need this space a little or no rental cost because of our limited resources. Anyone who could provide this space may be entitled to use the imputed rental value as a charitable tax deduction.
