EUCCHARISTIC MIRACLES OF THE WORLD EXHIBIT IS

COMING TO ST. FRANCIS XAVIER, Jerseyville! This amazing exhibit is on loan to us for one day only! It can be viewed by the public Friday, June 29 from 11AM until 7:30PM in our church. View panels depicting the Eucharistic Miracle of Lanciano, Italy where 1200 years ago a priest who doubted the Real Presence of Jesus in the Holy Eucharist suddenly had the consecrated host turn into Jesus' Cardiac Tissue and the consecrated wine truly turned into His Precious Blood. The Host and Precious Blood remain intact still today and is still viewed by millions. Another beautiful Eucharistic Miracle occurred in Orvieto, Italy just north of Rome. Once again a priest who doubted that the host really changed into Jesus' body, had the consecrated host turn into a piece of flesh right before his eyes. The host then dripped blood on the corporal cloth that the priest uses when he celebrates Mass. That cloth is brought out every year for the Corpus Christi procession through the streets of Orvieto. These and many other Eucharistic Miracles can be viewed on the panels. Learn each story and grow deeper in your faith. Open to the public so plan on bringing your family and your friends to see this amazing display!

Baptism of St. John the Baptist, Vigil and Day – 23-24 June

2018 Afraid and amazed. The gospels from both the vigil and the day tell us not to fear. An unnamed angel stands near the father of John the Baptist saying, "Do not be afraid." At his somewhat surprising birth and naming, "all were amazed." Why? Because the hand of God is at work! How will I lean into God's hand this week? How will I trust in God's good mercy toward me? Let me sing Psalm 139 (or "O God, You Search Me" by Bernadette Farrell) all week.

June 24, 2018 -"WHO ARE YOU FOLLOWING?" The Solemnity of the Nativity of Saint John the Baptist You have heard that being a steward is a way of life. In other words, it is not *what we do* -- it is *who we are*. In the word *stewardship* is implied a level of *servant hood*; there is a willingness to serve God and others. Today's readings mention a few of the Biblical figures who were unlikely servants, raised up by God: Israel (Jacob), David, and John the Baptist. Each one was called into servant hood while in the womb and each allowed God to use him in the fulfillment of His plans. You and are I no different from these great holy men. We, too, were called into servant hood while in the womb. We were created to be good stewards of our lives and we should rejoice in it! Like John the Baptist, we live as servants of God, allowing our very existence to proclaim that Jesus Christ is Lord of our lives.

This weekend, June 23-24, there will be a missionary visit by Father Mariadas Chatla. The following is a brief explanation from the missionary diocese. The Diocese of Guntur was erected on 13 February 1940. At present there are about 220,000 Catholics in the diocese over a population of 5 Million. There are 87 parishes with nearly over 500 mission stations. Our Catholics mostly belong to a poorer class who live in utter poverty unable to eke out a living out of their meager daily wages of agricultural labor which is only seasonal. The diocese is situated along the seacoast and is subject to frequent hurricanes and floods, which devastate the houses of the poor people. Recent floods have devastated 35 villages of the diocese and thousands of people have been displaced with a total loss of their properties. The government has invited the diocese to help out in the relief and rehabilitation programs. The literacy rate is abysmally low due to poverty and ignorance. In order to provide education the diocese has opened a good number of primary schools and high schools with boardings. Diocese is working to create lasting change in the lives of these poor children. The faith of the people is really strong and they practice religion and are committed to the church. We have organized the catholic communities in the villages in the form of basic Christian communities in order to strengthen the Christian faith and foster the gospel values. Basic Christian communities are formed in 120 villages in the diocese. We have also organized 400 women associations. The diocese has to build chapels and churches in good number of villages, since we have got every year over 2000 adult baptisms. The problem of providing places of worship is over growing. The financial help support will help us in fostering vocations to priesthood and religious life or building a chapel to the new communities or education of the poor children or building homes to the victims of floods. Your help and support will go a long way in helping the less fortunate people in the diocese of Guntur, India. Thanking you.
