Twenty-sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time Nm 11:25-29 / Jas 5:1-6 / Mk 9:38-43, 45, 47-48 In today's first reading, we see Joshua tattling on Eldad and Medad for prophesying to the people. In Joshua's mind, Moses is the only one worthy of that action. Similarly, in the Gospel we see John complaining that someone was driving out demon's in Jesus' name. Jesus response to John is a call to us all: "There is no one who performs a mighty deed in my name who can at the same time speak ill of me. For whoever is not against us is for us." As missionary disciples, we have been empowered. Our discipleship requires us to perform good, even mighty deeds in the name of Jesus, but be aware of the fact that Jesus' statement can be reversed: For whoever is not FOR us is AGAINST us. Live intentionally!! We have NOT been called into a life of numb passivity. That lifestyle impedes the work of God! Consider the words of Moses: "Would that all the people of the LORD were prophets! Would that the LORD might bestow his spirit on them all!" How blessed we are that God has bestowed his spirit upon us all! As fully alive missionary disciples, we must be stewards of that gift, recognize the gift and live a life worthy of it!

Not against us. Really! We may be surprised at who speaks and acts in God's name. We should never be jealous of righteous acts and good words, regardless of who does them.
