The Archdiocese has 175 priests of whom 160 are indigenous. It has 56 parishes and 150 Missions. 90% of the population served by the Archdiocese live in rural places.

We are excited to announce that, after many months of preparation, organization, and recruiting, we have finally begun helping the poor and those in need in Calhoun county. There are four families that have been provided financial assistance for utilities, clothing, school supplies, and educational assistance. We would like to introduce to you who we are and what we are about:

The Mission of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul

"A network of friends, inspired by Gospel values, growing in holiness and building a more just world through personal relationships with and service to people in need."

Who We Are

Inspired by Gospel values, the Society of St. Vincent de Paul, a Catholic lay organization, leads women and men to join together to grow spiritually by offering person-to-person service to those who are needy and suffering in the tradition of its founder, Blessed Frédéric Ozanam, and patron, St. Vincent de Paul.

As a reflection of the whole family of God, members, who are known as Vincentians, are drawn from every ethnic and cultural background, age group, and economic level. Vincentians are united in an international society of charity by their spirit of poverty, humility and sharing, which is nourished by prayer and reflection, mutually supportive gatherings and adherence to a basic Rule.

Organized locally, Vincentians witness God's love by embracing all works of charity and justice. The Society collaborates with other people of good will in relieving need and addressing its causes, making no distinction in those served because, in them, Vincentians see the face of Christ.

What Makes Us Unique?

What is different about SVDP, that is unlike any other charitable organization, is that we strive to be a "hand up" and not just a "hand out". Before any assistance is given to a client, a home visit is conducted. The home visit is performed by Vincentians of the local conference in pairs of two. There is a formalized interview of the prospective client where questions about their needs and current income are discussed.

The 2 Vincentians are trained to evaluate the client's needs and are empowered to make decisions about how much assistance the Conference can provide. The assistance can take the form of rent assistance, utility payments, food donations (staples from our food pantry), clothing, furniture, mattresses, or gift cards from local grocery stores for perishables. All clients, and assistance provided to them, are carefully documented in a database. The database comes in handy for documenting what has been given to a client and how often it is given. It is also necessary to maintain records for our non-profit status.

All assistance, except for non-perishable food items and gift cards for supermarkets, is paid directly to the provider by SVDP to ensure that the money is being used for that purpose only illicit purposes. We give assistance to clients for no more than 2-3 months (except special cases). If we see that they are not trying to improve their situation, we move onto other folks that need help (some exceptions may arise like single mothers trying to escape poverty or the elderly or disabled that have no opportunity for improvement).

Other means of assistance include providing information on other charities, government agencies, Pro-Life groups to help with unwanted pregnancies (we have one here in Calhoun, Calhoun for Life that we are partnering with), and programs providing schooling assistance and babysitting services for single mothers to help them out of their situations. Vincentians also evangelize where possible, trying to bring Jesus into the lives of their clients.

The Society of St. Vincent DePaul of Blessed Trinity and St. Francis of Assisi

Currently here in Calhoun, we have accomplished the following:

- * 14 people that have volunteered to become Vincentians.
- * Obtained IRS approval under our EIN as a 501(c)(3) for a non-profit organization
- \ast $\;$ Named our President, Vice President, Treasurer, and Secretary
- * Applied for and received aggregation by the National SVDP Society
- * Applied for our Illinois Tax exemption
- * Scheduled two training sessions for our Vincentians on how to perform home visits.
- * Attended meetings at three local St. Louis area SVDP Conferences (and spoken to three others) to learn how they administer to the poor
- * Applied for liability insurance through the National Society for our Conference
- * Attended the most recent Southern Springfield Diocese Council quarterly meeting
- * Have begun our recruitment of new members by insertions into in weekly bulletins and will soon witness after Mass.
- * Our Southern Springfield Society of SVDP is requesting financial assistance from the National SVDP Council, the St. Louis Council, and the other conferences in our Diocese for startup funding for our new conference (referred to as twining). We are hoping to obtain funding in the range of \$5 -10 K for this effort.
- * Implemented our new local answering service for those in need (618-310-1141).
- * Our Southern Springfield Diocese SVDP has pledged to help us by attending our bi-monthly meetings, assisting us with recruiting/marketing, data base development, home visit training, and help with developing our website.

What are the needs of Calhoun County? We have investigated the demographics for Calhoun County. In summary, it shows a population that is shrinking and aging quickly. 23% of all Calhouners are 65 or older, and nearly 13% of all Calhouners live in poverty. Of the 13% that live in poverty, the number one demographic are females, ages 25-34, and the second are those 65 and older.

We developed our annual budget based on these demographics and referencing the annual budgets of our sister SVDPs in the St. Louis metro area. If we take the total population of Calhoun, currently 4,802, multiply it by the % in poverty (12.8%) we come up with 615 people that live in poverty in Calhoun. Divide that by the average number of people per household (2.5) you come up with 246 families in poverty. If you assume that Calhoun SVDP can help 25% of those families / year (every family each four years) that equates to 61 families/year. Now assume that we can provide \$500 assistance to each of those families with either food, rent, or utility help, that would equate to a budget of nearly \$31,000/year.

While investigating the main source of funding for the local area SVDP Societies, nearly all replied by stating that 80-90% of their funding comes from individual donors. Church collections, bake sales, and church meals, like sausage breakfasts and dinners, equate to only a 10-20% of their budgets. We currently have donors that have pledged nearly \$10,000 - we have a long way to go to reach our goal!

As you can see, there has been a lot of work done thus far, but we need more funds. Thus far, and moving forward, our members have been bearing the startup cost (materials, application fees for our 501 c 3 tax exemption, etc.) The Society members usually take care of the administrative costs, so all the money donated goes directly to the poor.
