All Confirmations and First Holy Communions in the Diocese of Springfield are cancelled through December, 2020.

So, the entire schedule is being withdrawn, and it will be rebuilt as soon as we have clarity on how long large gatherings of people are to be suspended.

### St. Vincent de Paul Update

As we near our first anniversary, we are happy to report nearly \$20,000 of our \$30,000 first-year goal has been raised and administered to our neighbors in need. In order to avoid duplication of efforts, SVDP has partnered with other local agencies such as the Warrior Food Bank, Angel Ministries and Illinois Valley Economic Development. Together we have assisted 27 families, consisting of 67 individuals, by distributing over \$20,000 in rent, mortgage, car and utility payments as well as food, furniture and clothing. Our 18 Vincentian members have donated over 1,000 hours in service to the poor.
