St. Francis of Assisi Annual Parish Financial Report (July 1, 2019—June 30, 2020)

I am very pleased to share that during this fiscal period, we turned our financial situation around and can report surpluses for both parish and school. Additionally, we were able to pay approximately \$163,000.00 toward our debt owed to the diocese.

How did we accomplish this after successive years of running up debt? You stepped up and made tremendous sacrifices. You increased giving and helped St. Norbert Support Club raise over \$150,000. We also raised tuition and significantly cut school and parish expenses. We participated in the Federal Government's Paycheck Protection Program (PPP), where we were awarded just over \$62,000. (\$41,000 was spent on parish and school payroll during the reporting fiscal period while the remainder has been used for 2020/2021 expenses.)
