Diocesan Year of the Eucharist (Dec. 8 2022- Dec. 8 2023) During this special year parishes of the diocese are encouraged to increase their devotion to the Eucharist. The diocese is offering a special "traveling monstrance" for each parish to use for Adoration. The monstrance was dedicated to the Right Reverend H.D. Junker, D.D. Bishop of Alton, IL by the German Catholics of Quincy, IL. On July 29, 1853, Pope Pius IX created the first downstate Illinois diocese, naming Quincy as the See City. Prior to the creation of the Quincy diocese, the area in which we live was under the diocese of Chicago. It was not until 1857 that our first bishop, Bishop Juncker, D.D., was consecrated and the See was transferred to Alton, the territory of the diocese of Springfield in Illinois. Eucharistic Congress: You are invited to a historical diocesan-wide celebration at the BOS Center in Springfield - To celebrate the Diocesan Year of the Eucharist and the 100th anniversary of the transfer of the See city from Alton to Springfield, the Eucharistic Congress is taking place Saturday, October 28 at the BOS Center in Springfield. This dynamic experience will include nationally recognized Catholic speakers, adoration, confession, and Mass. The arena will be packed with thousands of Catholics from across the diocese. To attend, contact the parish office as each parish in the diocese is given a specific number of available seats. You can inquire about reserving a seat through the parish office starting July 1, or if you are interested in volunteering, you can register now!
